

- We recruit, train, support and mentor pro bono attorneys on cases





- Immigration Court phone and WebEx appearances



HOW YOU CAN HELP

Volunteer Opportunities

Telephonic orientations & Screenings

- Spanish speakers
- Portuguese speakers
- Guatemalan and other indigenous language speakers
- Do not have to be an attorney

Full and limited Representation

- Attorney
- Paired with an attorney
- Do not have to speak the language

How do I volunteer?

- Two step process:
 - 1. Sign up on our website
 - 2. Fill out a volunteer application and choose "MPP"

Clients in Need of Representation

- Ms. YRE, Mr. ARP, Mr. ARR, Mr. IARR, and Mr. IDRR are a family of two parents and their three children from Honduras. They are seeking asylum because a major transnational gang has been attempting to kill Mr. ARP and harassing the family for years since Mr. ARP refused to pay a protection fee to them. Ms. YRE's brother and a friend were killed in an attack targeting Mr. ARP. The family has moved twice to different places in Honduras, but the gang continued to find and threaten them. Ms. YRE has an older son who came with their family to the US but was deported back to Honduras. The family was previously in the Migrant Protection Protocols and are now living in South Carolina; their case is venued out of Charlotte. Ms. YRE, Mr. ARP, Mr. ARR, Mr. IARR, and Mr. IDRR seek pro bono representation for their asylum claim.
- Mr. LGT and Ms. ECG are a husband and wife from Cuba. They are seeking asylum because Mr. LGT was threatened by the police for speaking out about his political opinions. They were formerly in MPP and were ordered removed in absentia because they were kidnapped in Mexico and missed a hearing date. They are now living in the US in Florida with their infant US citizen daughter; their case is venued out of Harlingen. Mr. LGT and Ms. ECG seek pro bono representation for a motion to reopen their case.
