Accused of organizing Ghost Town Day and collaborating with Ambazonian fighters, threatened with going to notorious Kondengui Prion, and interrogated about political activities

Julian should provide details of politically motivated beatings

Detained for more than 1 week

Describe how he escaped jail

Escape from Jail & Decision to Flee

- Where did you go when you got out of jail?
- How did you feel physically? How did you feel emotionally?
- What did you do next?
- Why did you decide that you couldn't stay in Cameroon safely?

Forced to stay in hiding at a friend's house

Julian was in great physical pain and very scared when released

Learned that police were looking for him at University, his house, and his family's house & restaurant. Realized it wasn't safe to stay in Cameroon

Fleeing Cameroon

- Where did you stay while you were making plans to leave the country?
- How did you decide where to go?
- Did you obtain travel documents to go to the US? How?
- Can you describe what happened on the day you fled Cameroon?
- What, if any, safety precautions did you take when you left Cameroon?

Had to stay in hiding; opportunity presented itself to use a Nigerian passport with US visa

Escaped into Nigeria using someone else's passport; then flew to the US using visa

Told immigration officials at airport the truth and ended up detained
